

Literacy—"We're Going on a Bear Hunt" by Michael Rosen

Read the story to your child or watch Youtube

Use your sensory props (or the sensory bottles you made)

Is your child starting to show any recognition of the story, anticipating certain chants? Joining in with actions?



Make sensory bottles to go with the "We're Going on a Bear Hunt" story – this time we are going to make one for mud and one for snow!

Mud— add about 6cm soil or compost to your bottle and add enough water so that it makes a good noise when you shake it around.

Snow— add desiccated coconut to a dry bottle or white cotton wool balls or pompoms. Put lids on, tighten and tape up/ glue.

Week 4

Communication and Language / Number

Sensory/Messy Play (linked to Bear Hunt)

Chocolate Angel Delight "mud" - Make up 2 packs of Chocolate Angel Delight (most supermarkets do a cheaper own brand or choc pudding mix) and allow to set. Tip out into a washing up bowl or tray and have fun making it go "squelch squerch"! You could use a pair of wellies to represent walking through it or just use your hands. You could add some small world plastic people if you have any.



Sensory "Snow" - there are many ideas for this: Desiccated coconut/ icing sugar/ flour / moon sand/ baking powder/ foam/ squirty cream

Expressive Arts and Design – music and movement

Play different pieces of music at different times – how does your child react? Encourage them to move to the music – jumping, spinning, waving their arms, pumping the air etc to disco music or rock. Try some Country and Western/ Classical music. Play happy songs, play blues. You could use scarves/ tea towels to flap around to the music. Make a note of any they really seem to like, and try them again.
