Curriculum Focus: Sharing our community

All of our students have enjoyed catching the first glimpses of Spring and exploring our environment around us as we have entered a new season. Lots of walks have been taken in the neighbouring towns of Wetherby, Knaresborough and Harrogate and students have enjoyed exploring these areas with their classmates. We have enjoyed seeing some of the wildlife that is in abundance at this time of year and have begun to see colours flourish in garden centre visits and walks in the community.

Classes have been thinking about their local environment in recycling work, the school has become a 'No-Straw' zone following a presentation done by Sixth Form and another group have begun an EcoBrick project; these are bricks made out of non-recyclable plastics that can be sent to countries in poorer parts of the world to be used as building materials. The process involves taking clean, dry, non-recyclable plastics, cutting them into small pieces and stuffing them as tightly as possible into a plastic bottle.
