Look at each item in your first aid kit – if you don't have one look for one online. Discuss what they might be used for and in what situations you might need them.



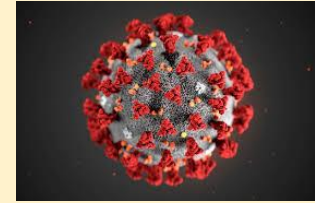

Can you make a poster to remind people we sill need to be very very careful

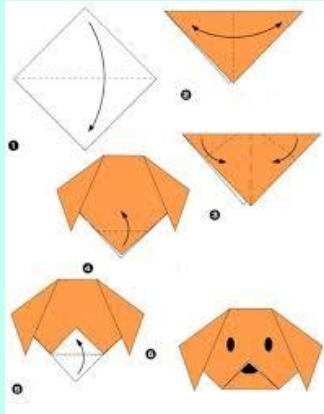

Read scales to the nearest labelled division.

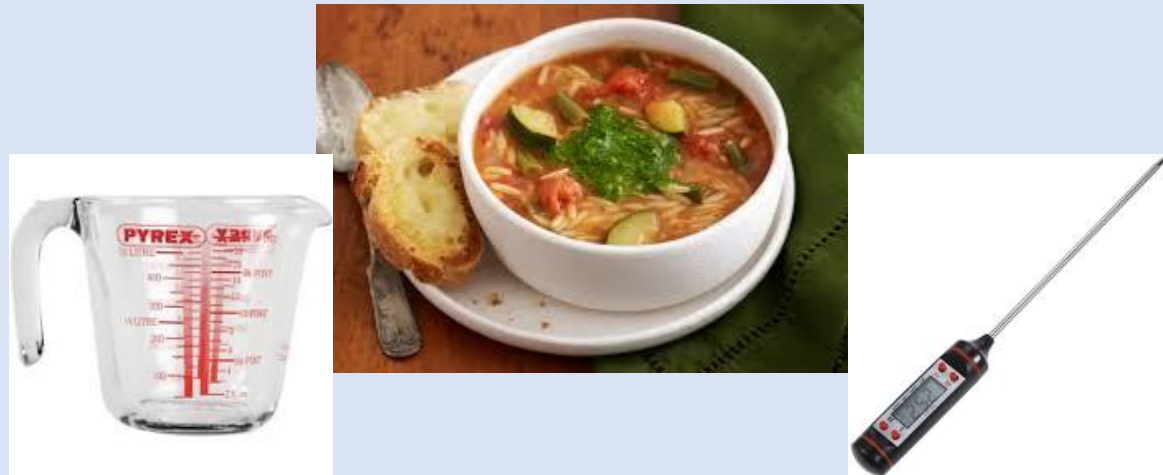
Know how to read a thermometer, and understand that temperature can be measured on different scales.
