- All staff are informed of school's safeguarding arrangements including the role and identity of the DSL and deputy.

3. Safeguarding Induction and Training of New Staff

All new staff, volunteers and governors complete an online learning package developed by the NYSCP and provide copies of their certificates which are kept on file. In addition, new staff, volunteers and governors attend face-to-face safeguarding training and are asked to read relevant policies and guidance as part of their induction.

8. Other Comments on Safeguarding Issues

- Refresher training has been delivered to all existing staff and new staff have received face-to-face training as part of their induction.
- Updates from Keeping Children Safe in Education 2023 have been shared with staff, including the new emphasis on filtering and monitoring systems. Staff have been reminded of their roles and responsibilities around monitoring what's happening on screens and reporting any problems or concerns.
- The DSL has completed Web Filtering & Monitoring Training for DSLs (7th November 2023) provided by Smoothwall, our firewall provider.
- The DSL liaises with class teachers when Smoothwall notifications are received in order to share details of the individuals involved, understand the circumstances surrounding notifications and provide support where necessary.
- The DSL has used the filtering and monitoring checks available on testfiltering.com (as recommended by Smoothwall) to test that our filters effectively block access to child sexual abuse, terrorism, adult content and offensive language for staff and pupils.
